## **HOTEL PRE-CON**

Hope everyone is doing well and looking forward to another Malice as much as I am! Here's some information that might help you enjoy our 27<sup>th</sup> Malice Domestic.

#### **BOX LUNCHES**

Since there will be events on Friday as well as Saturday and Sunday, we will again have the hotel provide "boxed lunches" available for sale at the Starbucks in the hotel lobby for those who don't want to go out to lunch. Box lunches will be a choice of sandwich: vegetarian, beef or turkey. Each selection comes with a side, fruit, individual bag of potato chips and one soft drink or bottled water. Cost for each boxed lunch is \$15, including tax.

#### **GETTING TO THE HOTEL**

If you're wondering about the cheapest way to get to the hotel, it's difficult to provide specifics since I can't be aware of what airline you're using or your point of departure/arrival. The absolute cheapest means of transportation to the hotel is flying into Reagan National Airport and taking Metro (the subway) which runs from the airport to the hotel (the Bethesda exit is RIGHT at the hotel) but again, that depends on what airline you're using and which airport services them. It also may be difficult depending on how much luggage you have and want to tote on Metro. # MALICE DOMESTIC 11: ANTHOLOGY SUBMISSION SPECS

### Theme: Murder Most Conventional

"Murder Most Conventional" means that the story takes place at or has some relationship to a convention. It can be a mystery convention like Malice Domestic or any other type of convention (sci-fi, business, etc.).

Story Length: 3,500 to 5,000 words List word count on last page

#### Manuscript file must be entirely anonymous

No author identification on the cover page or on any other page No author identification in the "document summary" Author must identify himself/herself only in the content of the cover email

#### **Fonts and Formatting**

Generally, follow the Chicago Manual of Style

Story title: 16 point Times New Roman or equivalent, centered

Body of story: 12 point Times New Roman or equivalent

Spacing: double spaced

Margins: 1 inch top and bottom margins, 1 inch right and left margins

Indentation: use tab to indent

Do not use the spacebar to indent

Normal indent is .5 inch

All pages must be numbered in the footer

Put story title in footer

Do not use the automatic hyphenation feature (this is an option in Word which automatically hyphenates long words at the end of lines. If you haven't turned this feature on, you shouldn't have a problem)

For dialog, use double quotes: "Xxxxxxx."

Submit manuscript in Microsoft Word format, if possible. A PDF file is acceptable.
